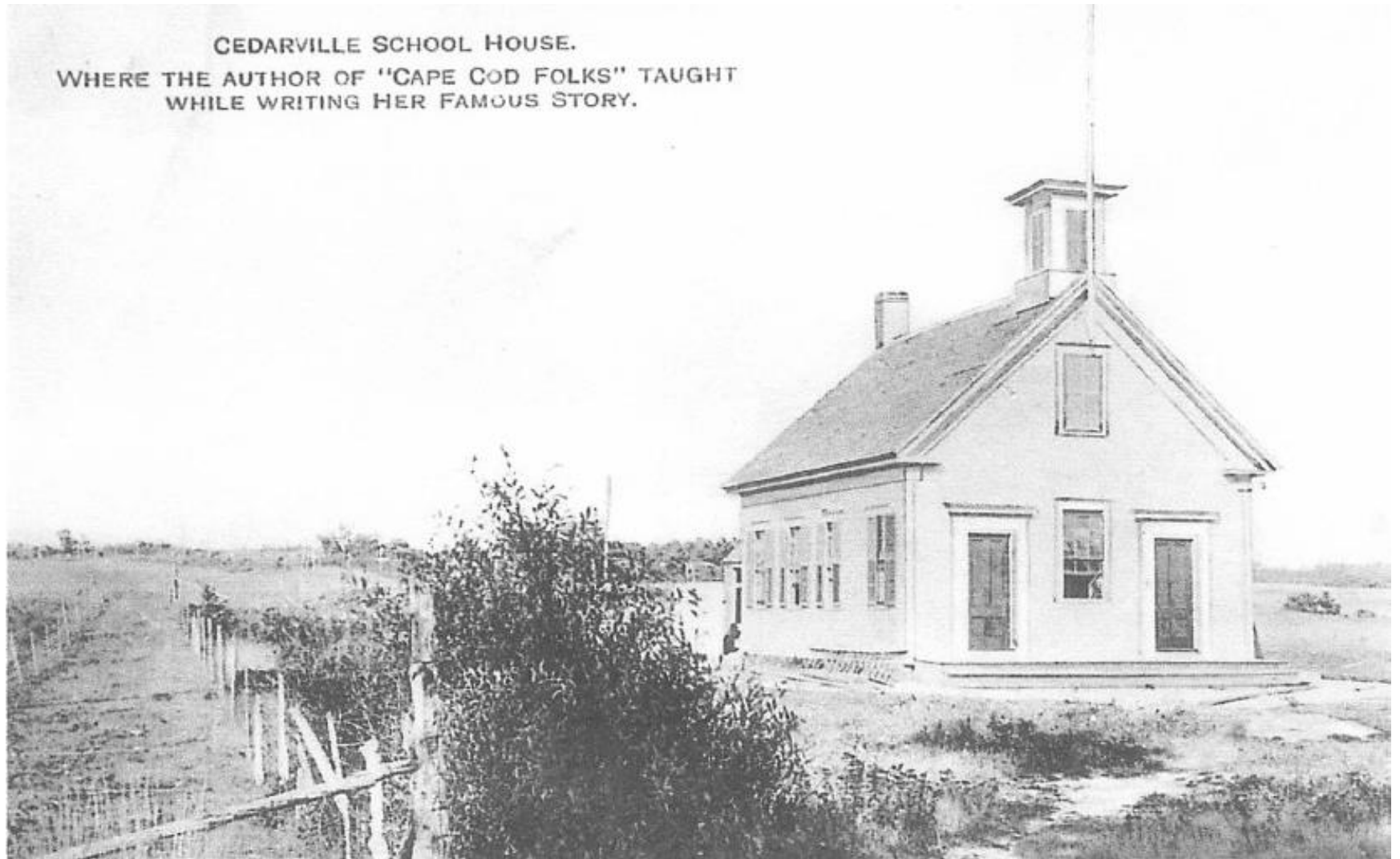


THE OPENING TO THE BEACH, CEDARVILLE, MASS

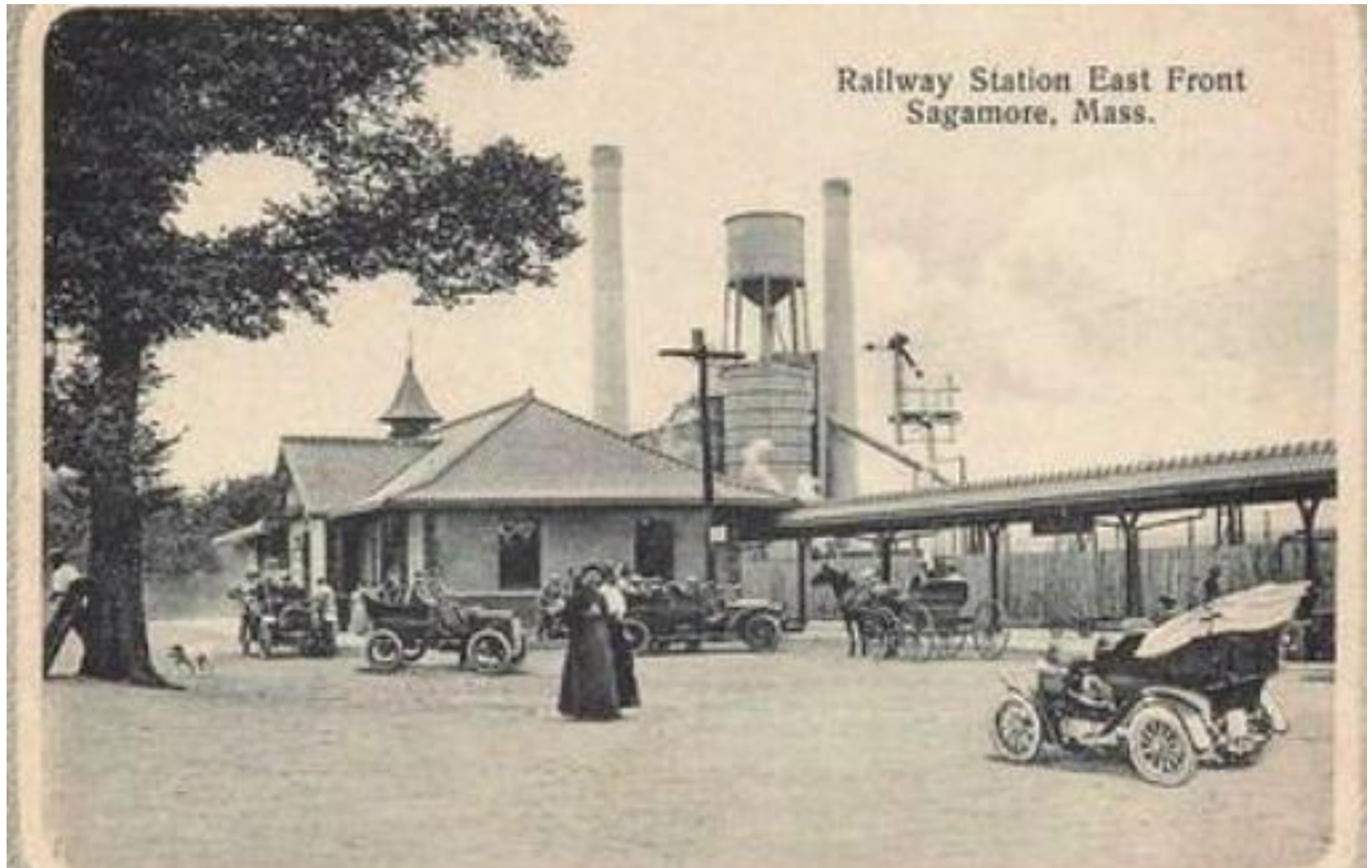

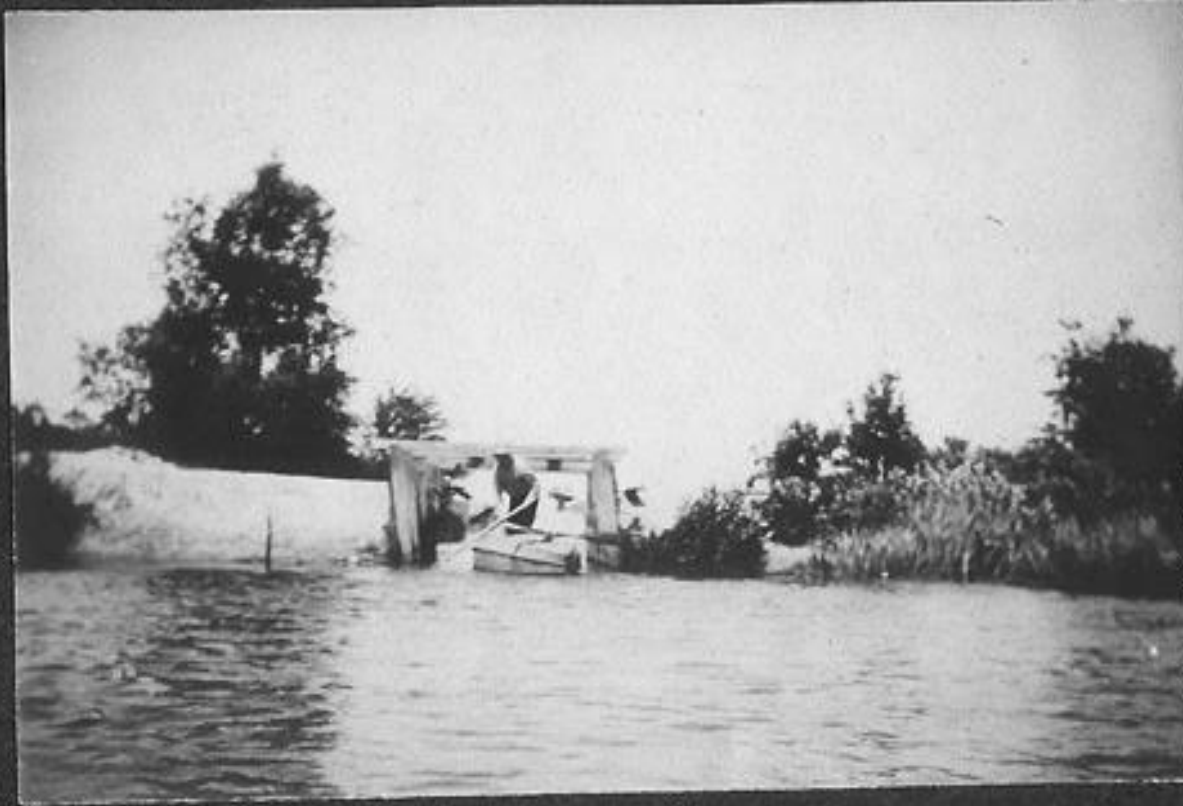
George Swift's Bait Shack at Ellisville Harbor used by lobstermen, taken around 1961.

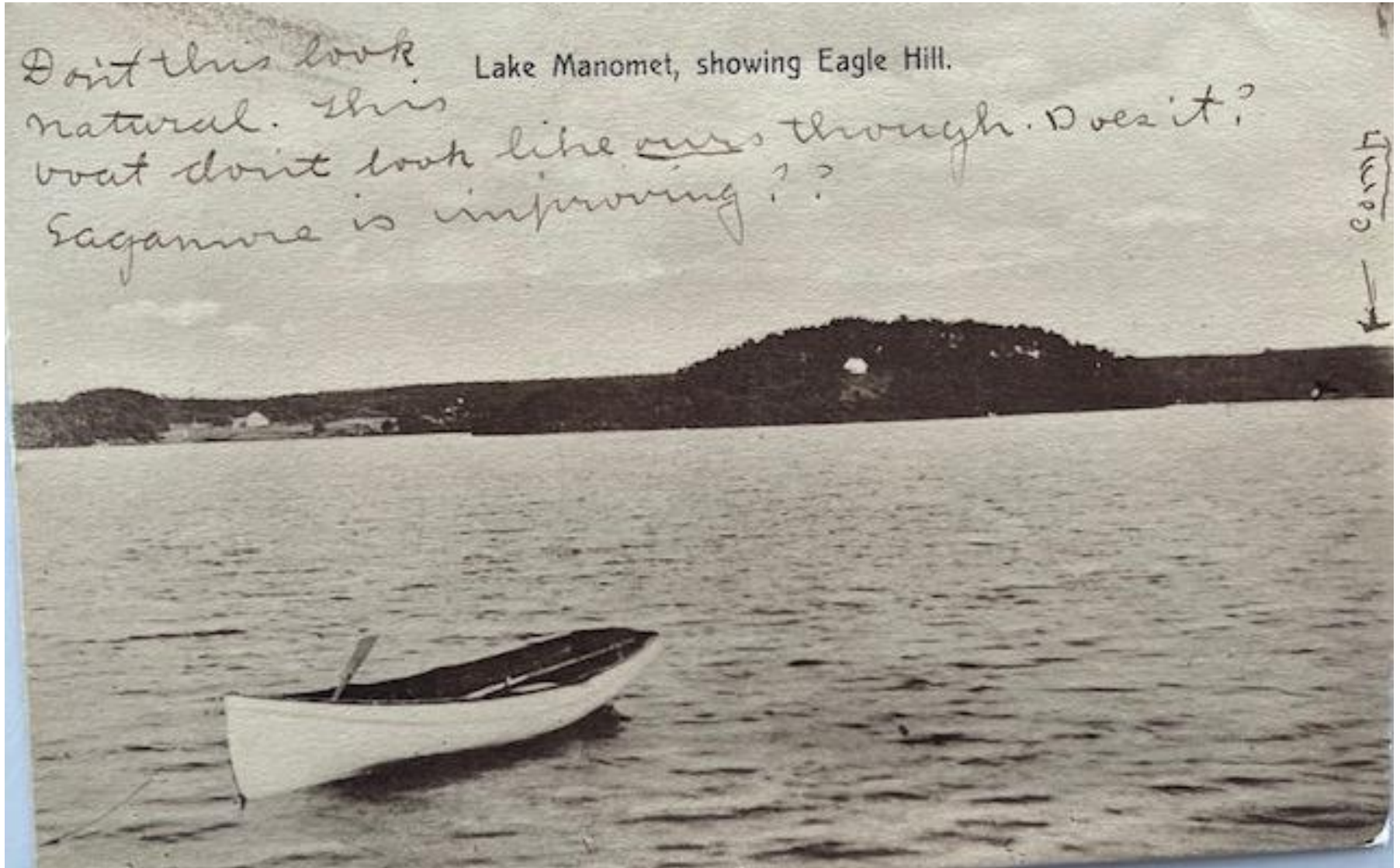

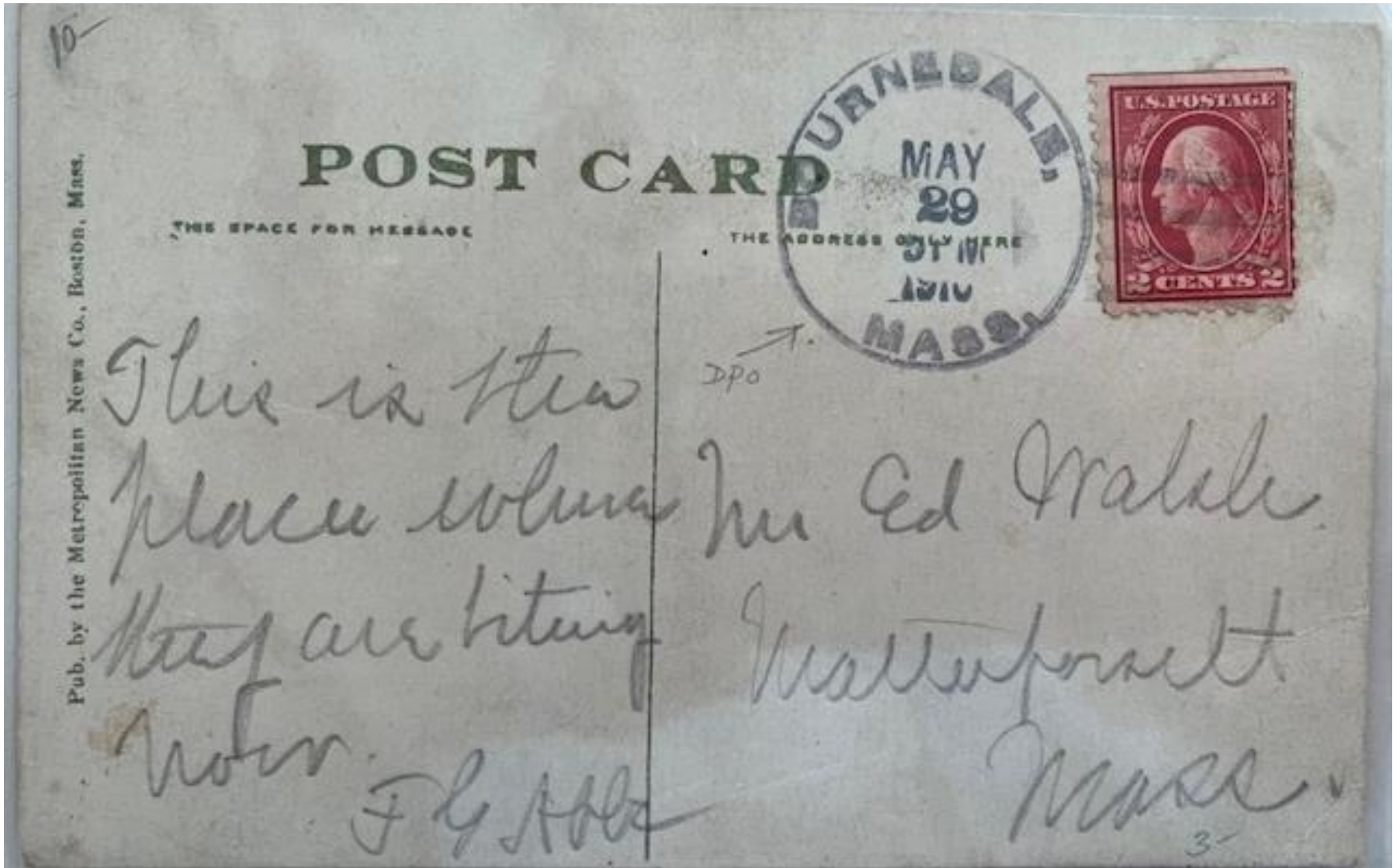

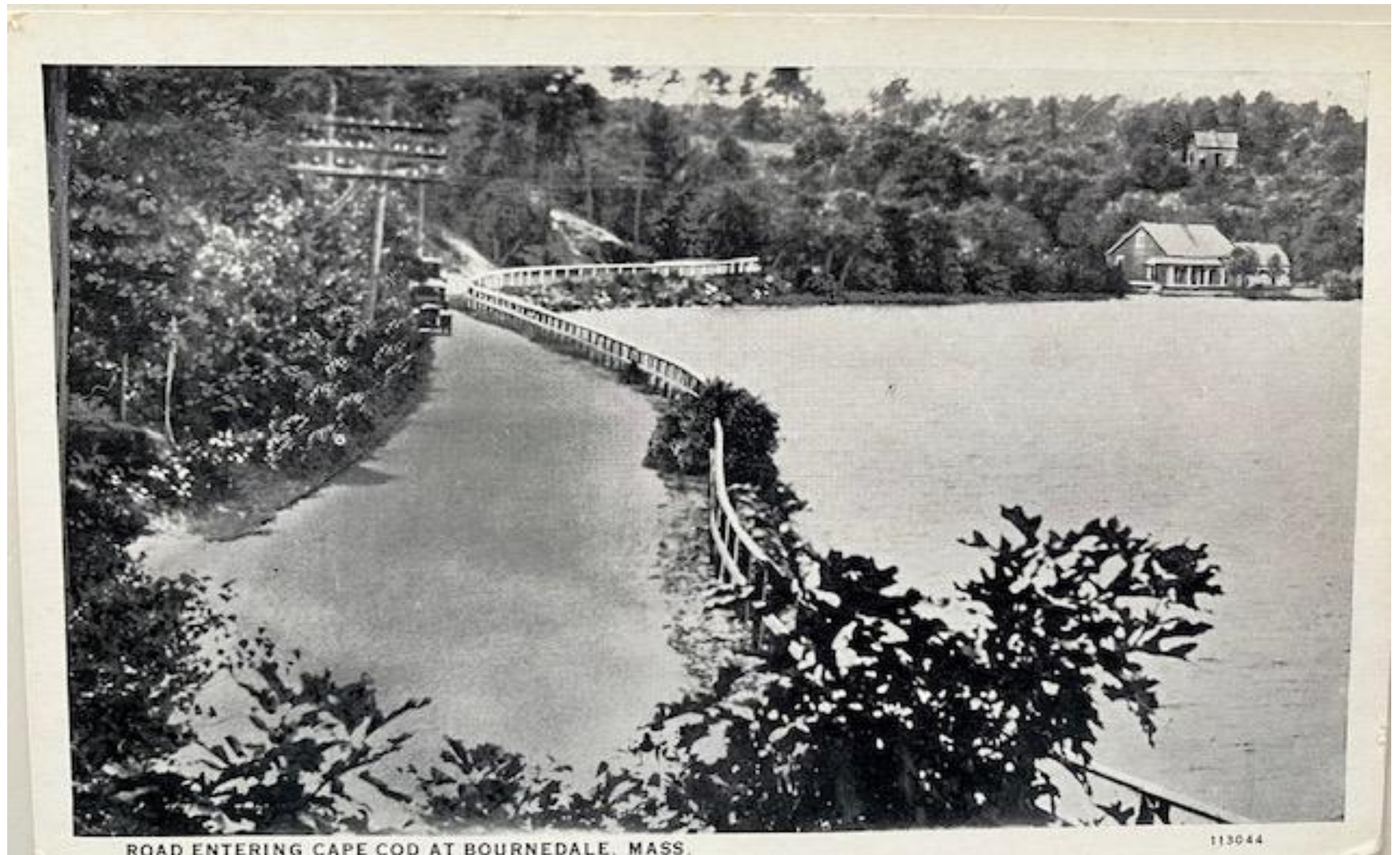

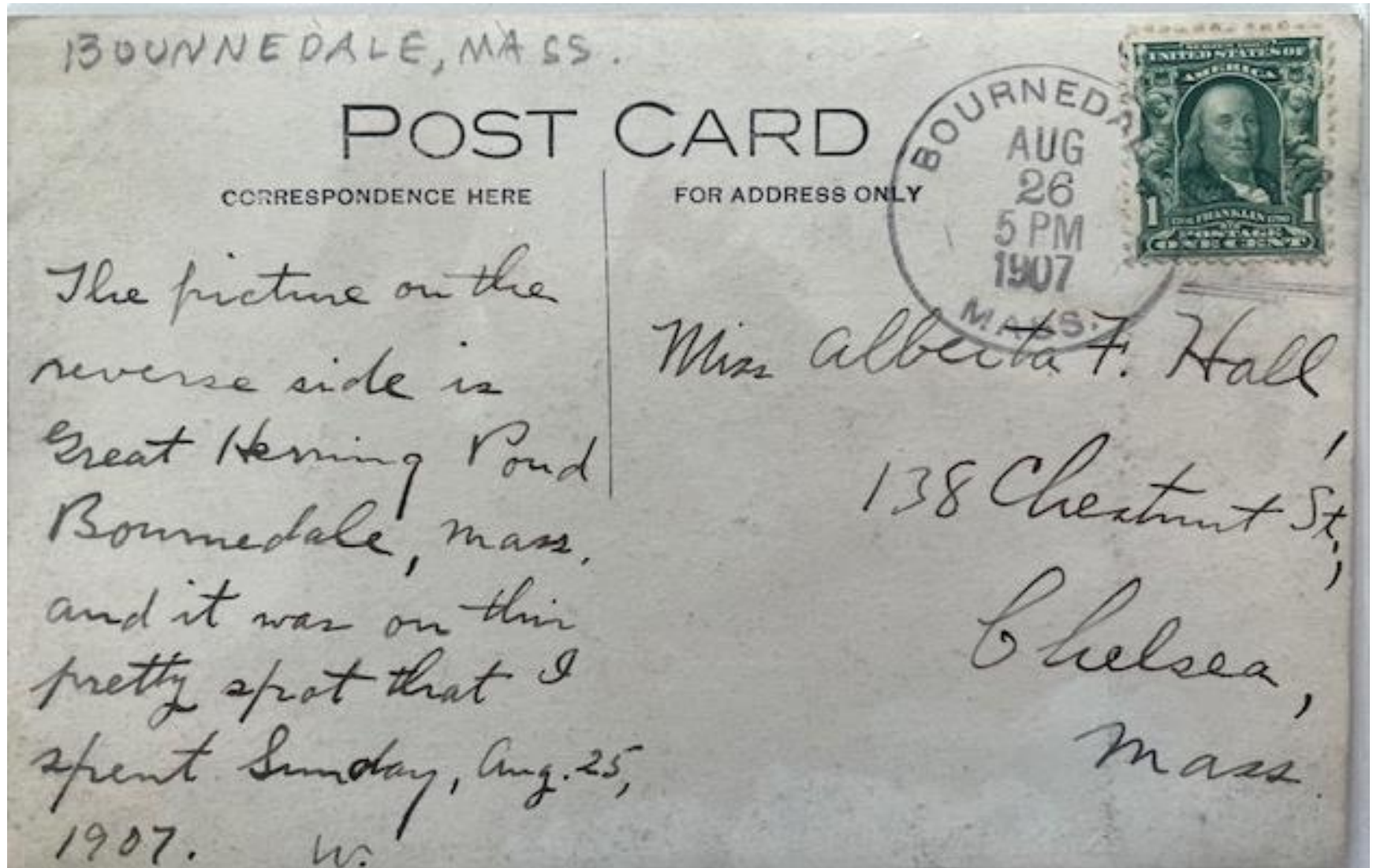

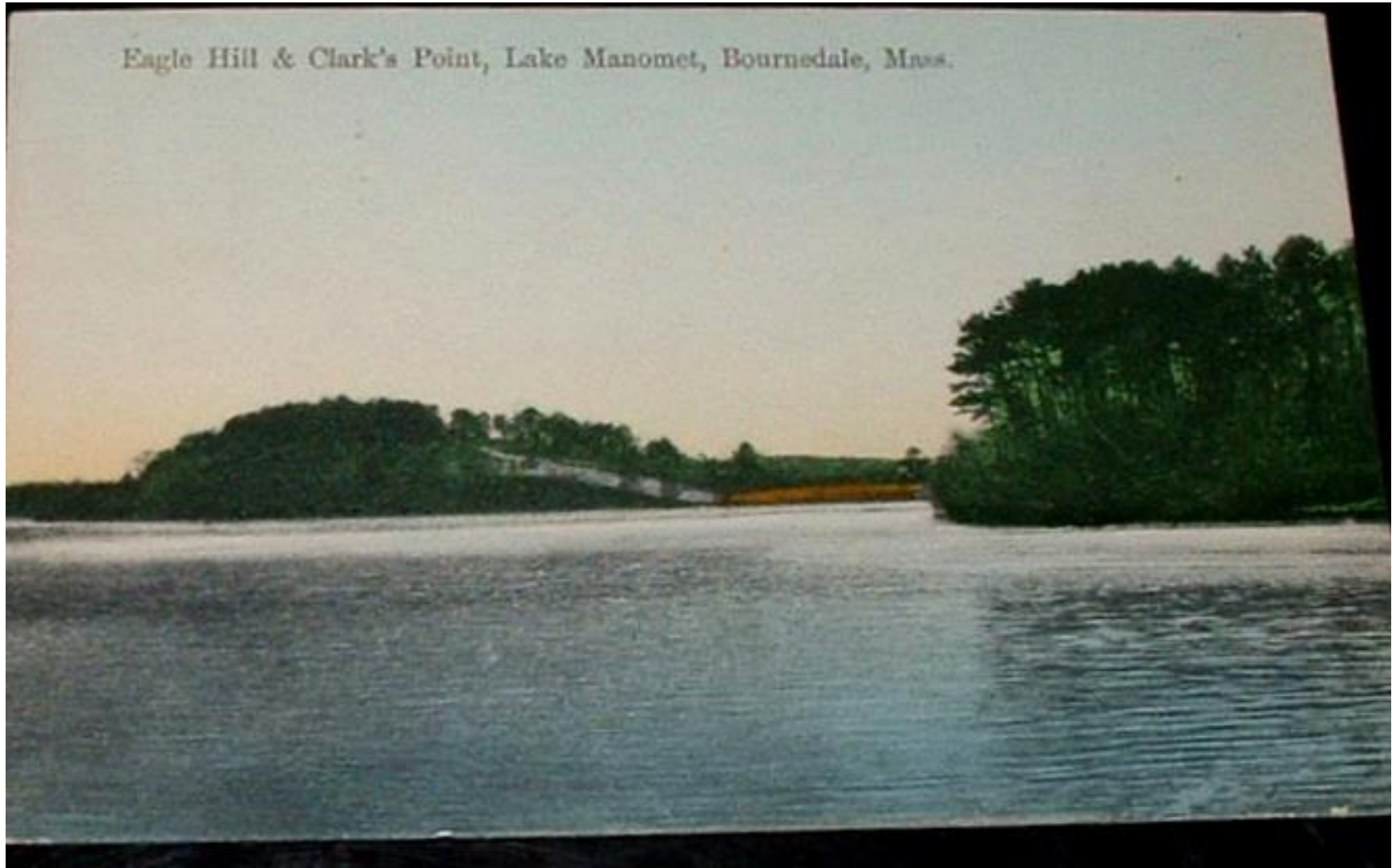
